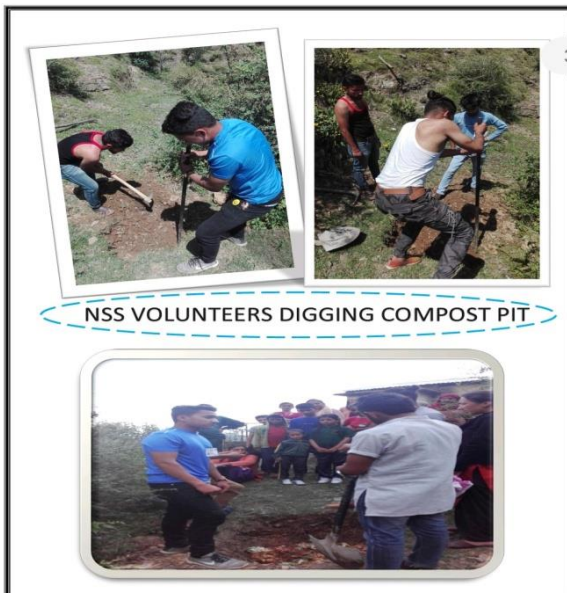

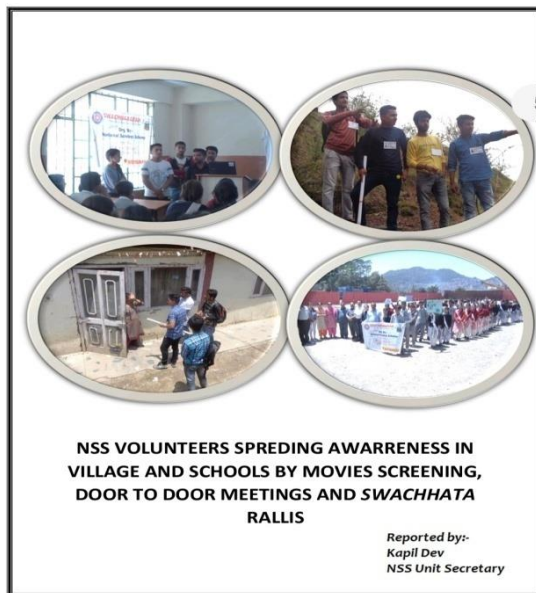

Report of Tree Plantation Drive led by Vikram Bhardwaj Asstt. Prof. Department of History, COE Government College Sanjauli

On 24-07-19, a group of students from the Department of History, NCC, NSS, and Rover and Rangers of COE Government College Sanjauli participated in a tree plantation drive at Surala. The drive was led by Vikram Bhardwaj, Assistant Professor of the Department of History.

The plantation drive was aimed at promoting awareness about the importance of trees and to encourage the students to take an active role in protecting the environment. The location of the drive was chosen based on the fact that Surala has a low tree cover, and the area needed reforestation.

The drive began early in the morning with the students gathering at the designated location. 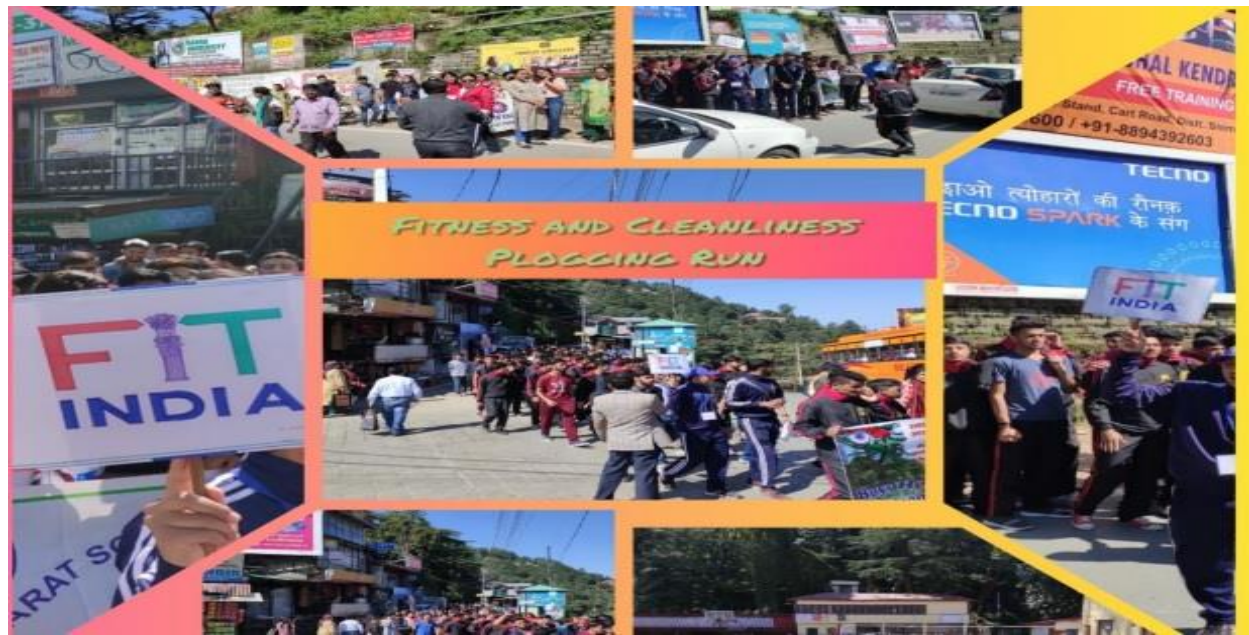
