## **Event: Invited Lecture by External Resource Person on 16 May 2025**

He's a PhD in English Literature and Psychology from Wisconsin University, Madison, USA. He is also a poet, reading poetry across the globe propagating the message of world peace.

Led by Associate Professor & Head, Dr Deepak Kaprate, the Resource Person was welcomed by the Department of English. The talk was organised in the Language Lab where more than 50 students, both undergraduate and postgraduate, were present. Dr Aditya Singh Dulta introduced Dr Rohta to the audience.
