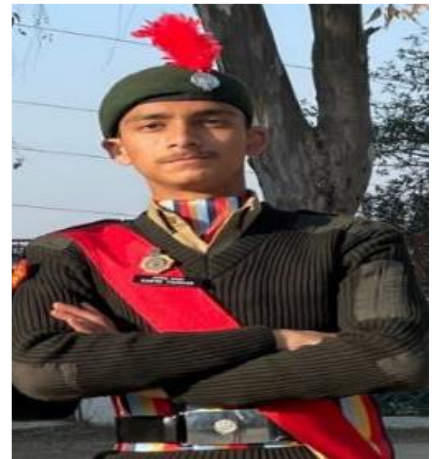

"ALL INDIA GIRLS TRAKKING CAMP 2024"

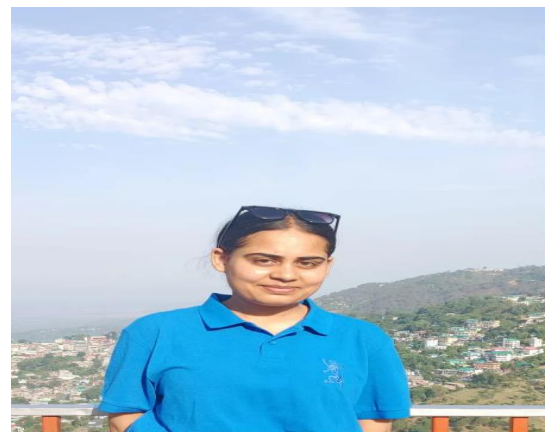
" Everyone wants to live on top of the mountain but all the Happiness and growth occurs while you are climbing it. "
