# Theme of Fifth EBSB webinar was: Anti corruption awareness

## Anti-Corruption Laws in India

Public servants in India can be imprisoned for several years and penalized for corruption under the:

- >> Indian Penal Code, 1860
- >> Prosecution section of Income Tax Act, 1961
- >> The Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988
- >> The Benami Transactions (Prohibition) Act, 1988 to prohibit benami transactions.
- >> Prevention of Money Laundering Act, 2002

Punishment for bribery in India can range from six months to seven years of imprisonment.

The Lokpal and Lokayuktas Act, 2013 which came into force from 16 January 2014, seeks to provide for the establishment of the institution of Lokpal to inquire into allegations of corruption against certain public functionaries in India.

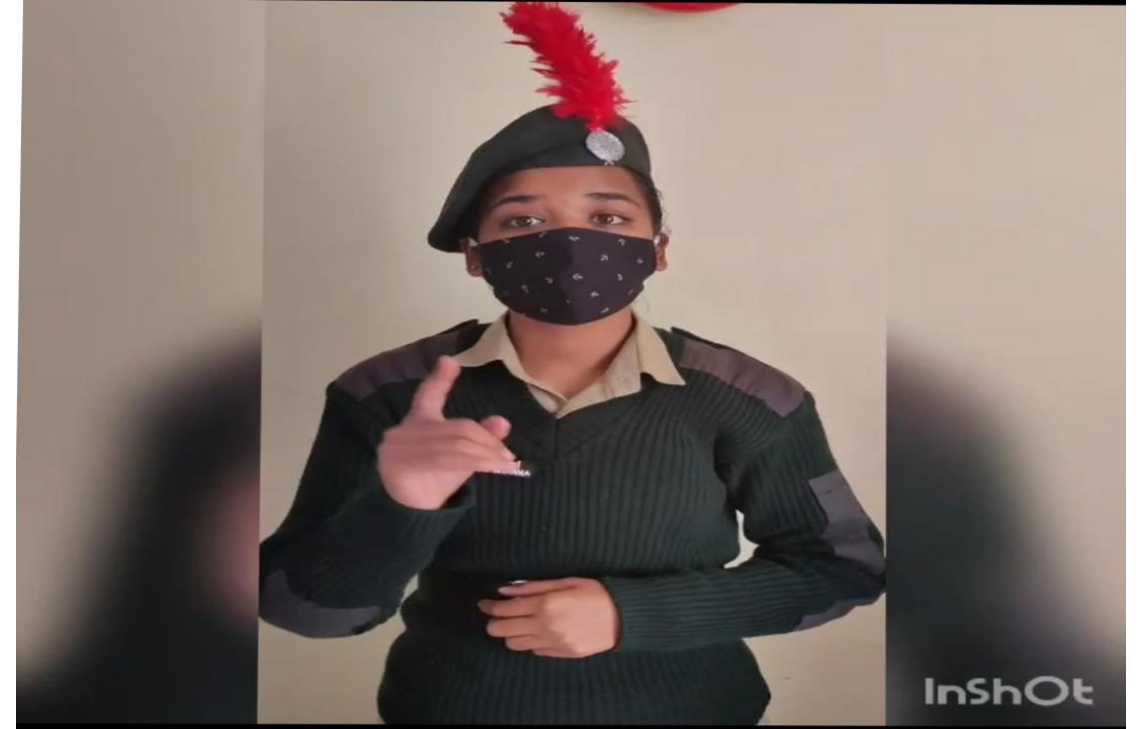
1. Commit to an anti-corruption programme 'from the top'

## Group of Monuments in Mahabalipuram

The Group of Monuments at Mahabalipuram declared as a WHS in 198, in Tamil Nadu, about 58 km from Chennai, were built by the Pallava kings in the 7th and 8th centuries. The town is said to have gained prominence under the rule of Mamalla. These monuments have been carved out of rock along the Coromandel coast.


