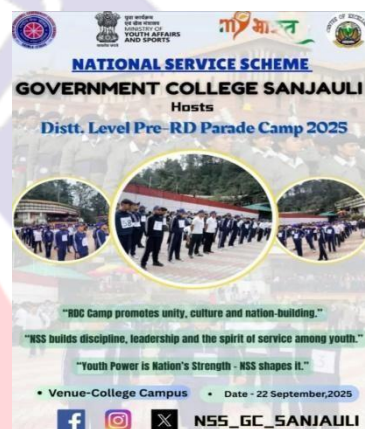

Introduction

The RDC (Republic Day Camp) is one of the most prestigious national-level camps organized under the National Service Scheme (NSS). It provides volunteers an opportunity to represent their respective states at the Republic Day Parade in New Delhi and to participate in various cultural, educational, and social activities.

In view of this, Government College Sanjauli hosted the RDC

Selection Camp on 22nd September 2025, under the guidance of the NSS Programme Officer. The event aimed to identify and select dedicated volunteers who demonstrate leadership qualities, social awareness, and a spirit of national integration. Volunteers from different colleges of Himachal Pradesh University region participated in the event. The program served as a platform for showcasing talent, discipline, and commitment to the volunteers.



Objectives:

The RDC selection at Government College Sanjauli was organized with the following key objectives:

1. To select potential NSS volunteers for participation in the Republic Day Camp.
2. To evaluate students' overall personality, communication skills, and discipline.
3. To encourage youth participation in cultural and patriotic activities.
4. To foster a sense of unity, teamwork, and leadership among NSS volunteers.
5. To provide exposure and opportunities for inter-college collaboration and interaction.

About the celebration:

In her address, the Principal appreciated the efforts of NSS volunteers in promoting social welfare activities and encouraged participants to perform with confidence and sincerity. The Programme Officer explained the significance of the RDC Camp and the selection process in detail. 4. Cultural Program and Selection Process The selection process included multiple rounds of evaluation, focusing on both cultural and intellectual performance. The day's schedule was divided into the following segments:

- a) Cultural Round-Volunteers presented a variety of performances such as patriotic songs, group dances, solo dances, skits, mono-acts, and poetry recitations. The theme of most performances revolved around national unity, women empowerment, social harmony, and environmental protection. The vibrant performances highlighted the creativity and cultural richness of Himachal Pradesh, leaving the audience spellbound.
- b) Personality and Communication Evaluation-In this round, each participant introduced themselves and shared their motivation for joining the NSS and participating in RDC. They were judged on confidence, clarity of expression, leadership qualities, and sense of responsibility.
- c) Question-Answer and Group Discussion-A panel of judges conducted a group discussion session where volunteers were given current social topics to discuss

— such as “Role of Youth in Nation Building” and “Environmental Conservation through Community Participation.” This helped in assessing their awareness, communication skills, and ability to work in a team.

d) Physical Fitness and Discipline Assessment

As RDC requires a high level of discipline and stamina, volunteers were also assessed on their marching, punctuality, posture, and uniform conduct. Judges took note of their overall discipline .

5. Judging and Evaluation

The judging panel consisted of experienced NSS Programme Officers and cultural coordinators from different colleges. The evaluation was based on the following criteria:



5. Knowledge of NSS and Social Awareness.

Each participant was given a score, and those achieving higher marks were shortlisted for the next stage of RDC selection. The judges appreciated the overall level of performance and the enthusiasm of the volunteers.

6. Participation from Other Colleges

The RDC selection at G.C. Sanjauli witnessed enthusiastic participation from nearby colleges such as G.C. Theog , G.C. Dhalli, RKMV Shimla, G.C. Koti, and G.C. Sunni. This inter-college interaction provided volunteers an opportunity to exchange ideas, experiences, and cultural diversity. The friendly yet competitive environment encouraged learning and mutual respect among the participants.

7. Outcome of the Selection Program

After the evaluation, the judges announced the names of shortlisted candidates who would proceed to the next level of RDC selection. These volunteers will later attend

the State-level Pre-RDC Camp for further training and selection for the national camp in Delhi .The selected students expressed their gratitude to the college and NSS unit for providing such a valuable platform. The non-selected participants also appreciated the fair judgment process and promised to improve their future events.
