

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**Action Taken Report on Students' Feedback**

Students are the primary stakeholders of the institution. Their feedback mainly focuses on curriculum delivery, teaching-learning process, infrastructure, and academic support.

Students suggested greater use of ICT tools in teaching-learning processes.	Faculty members were encouraged to integrate ICT tools such as multimedia presentations, digital resources, and online learning platforms to enhance classroom teaching.
Students requested more field visits and educational tours for practical exposure.	Departments organized educational tours, field visits, and practical training programs to provide experiential learning opportunities.
Prior Information about cancellation of class	Departments are formally notified through a notice issued by the Principal's Office to ensure that students are informed of any class cancellation at least 24 hours in advance.
Students suggested improvement in library resources and availability of reference books.	The college library was strengthened with the addition of new books, journals, and digital resources relevant to different subjects.
Students demanded more career guidance and competitive examination support.	Career counseling sessions, guest lectures, and workshops related to competitive examinations and employment opportunities were organized.
Students expressed the need for more seminars, workshops, and academic interactions.	Departments regularly organized seminars, webinars, and expert lectures to enhance academic exposure.
Students suggested increased opportunities for extracurricular and cultural activities.	Various cultural, sports, NSS, NCC, and co-curricular activities were organized to encourage holistic development of students.
Students highlighted the need for improved classroom and campus facilities.	Regular maintenance and improvement of classrooms, laboratories, and campus facilities were undertaken to ensure a conducive learning environment.




  
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
