The Nanomaterials Research Laboratory was established in the Department of Physics at the Centre of Excellence, Government College Sanjauli, under the DBT Star College Scheme in 2024. This was inaugurated by Sh. Rakesh Karwar, Secretary of Education, and Dr. Mahaveer Singh, Professor in the Department of Physics at HPU, during the International Conference hosted by the college. This initiative aims to foster research interest among students, as research is not a part of their standard curriculum. Under the guidance of Dr. Kirti Singha, B.Sc. IIIrd-year students successfully synthesized soft ferrite nanomaterials. The synthesized samples were sent to Shoolini University and NIT Hamirpur for XRD and FeSEM characterization. Building on this achievement, ten students presented posters based on their synthesis work at the International Conference held at the Centre of Excellence, Government College Sanjauli, on November 19-20, 2024.





Outcomes of the initiatives at the Nanomaterials Research Laboratory:

1. **Research Skills Development:**
 - o B.Sc. IIIrd year students successfully synthesized soft ferrite nanomaterials, gaining hands-on experience in advanced material synthesis techniques.
2. **Characterization and Collaboration:**
 - o Synthesized samples were sent for XRD and FeSEM characterization to prestigious institutions like Shoolini University and NIT Hamirpur, fostering inter-institutional collaboration.
3. **Student Participation in International Conference:**
 - o Ten students presented posters at the International Conference held at the Centre of Excellence, Government College Sanjauli, showcasing their research work on an international platform.

4. Enhanced Awareness and Knowledge Dissemination:

- o Approximately 150-200 students attended demonstrations on nanomaterial synthesis, enhancing their understanding of nanotechnology and its applications.

5. Workshop Participation:

- o Forty students from B.Sc. IIIrd and IInd years participated in a workshop at Shoolini University, gaining practical exposure to the fabrication of nanomaterials.

6. Motivation and Research Affinity:

- o These activities inspired a research culture among undergraduate students, motivating them to explore fields beyond their curriculum.

7. Skill Enhancement for Career Opportunities:

- o The hands-on training and exposure prepared students for future academic pursuits or careers in research, materials science, and nanotechnology.

These outcomes collectively contribute to creating a robust foundation for research-oriented learning at the undergraduate level.

Day 1: Inaugural Session





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
Use of ICT for Virtual Classrooms:




Vibrant Village Camp Kalpa (22-31st July 2024)



SURVEY AT DUMMI

Date: 22/08/2024

Introduction: A team of National Service Scheme volunteers of around 60 volunteers from Govt. College, Sanjauli, conducted a survey in Dummi village to assess the awareness and impact of various government schemes. The survey aimed to understand the challenges faced by the villagers in accessing benefits from these schemes and their overall experience with government services.

Objectives of the Survey:

1. To assess the level of awareness among villagers regarding key government schemes such as Ayushman Bharat, PM-Kisan, Swachh Bharat, and Ujjwala Yojana.
2. To identify the challenges and obstacles that hinder the effective implementation of these schemes in the village.
3. To gather feedback and suggestions from the villagers for improving the delivery of these schemes.

The NSS volunteers conducted face-to-face interviews, distributing questionnaires that focused on understanding the villagers' awareness, eligibility, and access to government schemes. They also gathered data on the socio-economic conditions of the villagers.

The survey highlighted both positive impacts and significant challenges related to the implementation of government schemes in Dummi village. While many villagers have benefitted from the schemes, issues like lack of awareness, poor access to digital services, and delays in benefit disbursement need to be addressed. The feedback gathered from this survey will be shared with relevant authorities to help improve the delivery of these schemes and ensure that the intended benefits reach every eligible villager.

INTRODUCTION

On August 22 and 23, 2024, under the guidance of Principal Prof. Bharti Bhagra, the Eco-Club of Centre of Excellence Govt. College Sanjauli organized a tree plantation drive. This drive was conducted as part of the "Plant for Mother Earth" campaign, initiated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Environment Day, under the theme "One Tree for Mother".

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the tree plantation drive were:

- To contribute to the college's environmental sustainability goals by planting trees in the college premises.
- To foster a sense of responsibility among students towards the environment.

EVENT DETAIL

The tree plantation took place on August 22, 2024, in the Benmore Ward near Jakhu. The event began with the planting of the first sapling of *Cedrus deodora* by the Principal, CoE, Govt. College Sanjauli, Prof. Bharti Bhagra. Approximately one hundred students, along with Eco-Club convenor Prof. Deepri Gupta and members Dr. Sushil Sharma and Prof. Sarla Thakur, participated in this initiative. Together, the teachers and students planted around one hundred *Cedrus deodora* saplings. After the plantation, all participants also initiated the cleanliness drive in surrounding areas near Jakhu temple.

On August 23, 2024, under the guidance of the Principal, the Eco-Club conducted another tree plantation drive within the college premises. In this initiative, Hibiscus, Rose, and Jasmine plants were planted in the college premises. Students and teachers were divided into groups each assigned a specific area within the college grounds. The plantation areas included the college boundary, near the sports field, and along the main entrance road. The teachers also guided the students about the techniques for planting and caring of the saplings.

In addition to plantation drive, the Eco-Club members also explained the long-term benefits of trees in terms of carbon sequestration, air purification, and supporting biodiversity. The session also covered the tips and tricks related to the sapling care including the techniques, timing of watering, and protecting the young plants from pests and diseases.

CONCLUSION

The tree plantation was a successful event that brought together students and teachers in a shared effort to improve the environment. The positive response and active participation of everyone is an indicator of growing awareness and commitment toward environmental issues. The members of the Eco-Club of the college will monitor the growth of the planted saplings and will organize a follow-up activity to ensure their survival.


An informative session was conducted during which the essence of peace was explored through two presentations.


